<u>Isaiah 46:9-10</u>: (NRSV) ⁹remember the former things of old; for I am God, and there is no other; I am God, and there is no one like me, 10 declaring the end from the beginning and from ancient times things not yet done, saying, My purpose shall stand, and I will fulfill my intention.

It happened just a few short weeks ago, but by now we are almost desensitized to the horror. In many ways we can feel like it's just another story of a senseless killer randomly taking lives. But it's not - what it is, is a chronicle of a world filled with inequity and evil, in which those who are innocent suffer and die and there are no real answers as to how to stop it. Is there someone to blame? Is it parenting? Is it education? Is it religion? Is it atheism? Is it freedom? Is it guns? Is it easy access to violence? Is it God? How do we begin to put these tragedies into some perspective? Stay with us - there IS an answer!

Does God even watch what happens to us here?

• This should have been a perfect night. A new movie, hundreds of excited people, many of them young. But one man made this the worst night of their lives. Just after midnight, the action on screen was replaced by chaos and it was all too real. It was the biggest movie event of the summer, the premier of the new Batman movie, The Dark Knight Rises. All across the country, diehard fans bought tickets weeks in advance. Lines stretched around the block. Many showed up dressed in costume.

What do we have? Tragedy by any measure and with tragedy comes explanations of all kinds. Did God save anyone? Could God have saved everyone? Here is an Atheist's perspective:

The Part-Time God and the Movie Theater Massacre: I may not believe in god, but I certainly understand why people do. Life is uncertain and the world can be a pretty cold and scary place, no matter what you believe. In such a world, the concept of a benevolent god who watches over each and every one of us and intervenes in events on our behalf can be appealing. The problems begin when one tries to apply that concept to reality.

People have been doing that a lot over the past week.

When James Holmes walked into an Aurora, Colorado movie theater, set off a couple of gas canisters and opened fire on patrons in the dark, some claim god intervened to save them personally. There are a few different versions of what god was doing while the shooting took place. What is certain is this: The god these people believe in allowed 12 people — including a six-year-old child — to be murdered and 58 people to be wounded.

Meet Pierce O'Farrill. He was in the theater with a friend when Holmes entered...O'Farrill was shot twice in the foot by the shotgun and assault rifle, and in his upper left arm with the Glock pistol. He says "there's no doubt in my mind" that god saved him. Specifically.

Several good points were in that blog - most notably that if God did save this particular person, then are we to assume He felt the others - including the six-year old child were merely expendable?

• I can't help but feel that to some extent we are reaping what we have been sowing as a society. We have said to God to get out of the public arena, lawsuit after lawsuit have chased away any fear of God, at least in the hearts of millions. Do we have a "very questionable God" or is there more to it?

Romans 8:18-22: (NASB) ¹⁸For I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory that is to be revealed to us. ¹⁹For the anxious longing of the creation waits eagerly for the revealing of the sons of God.

Isn't this the very reason that there are so many questions about tragedies like this one?

²⁰For the creation was subjected to futility, not willingly, but because of Him who subjected it,

Aha! The world is subject to evil because God put them there! Why would He do that??? Well, let's finish the sentence.

in hope ²¹that the creation itself also will be set free from its slavery to corruption into the freedom of the glory of the children of God.

That word for hope means "expectation." So God has great expectations!

²²For we know that the whole creation groans and suffers the pains of childbirth together until now.

So, does God have a plan to rid the world of tragedy?

God's plan starts at the beginning:

The original promise of prosperity

Genesis 1:27-28: (KJV) ²⁷So God created man in his own image, in the image of God created he him; male and female created he them. ²⁸And God blessed them, and God said unto them, Be fruitful, and multiply, and replenish the earth, and subdue it: and have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the fowl of the air, and over every living thing that moveth upon the earth.

The disobedience to the conditions of prosperity and its consequences

Genesis 3:4-6: (NASB) ⁴The serpent said to the woman, You surely will not die! ⁵For God knows that in the day you eat from it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil. ⁶When the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was a delight to the eyes, and that the tree was desirable to make one wise, she took from its fruit and ate; and she gave also to her husband with her, and he ate.

<u>Genesis 3:19</u>: (NASB) ¹⁹By the sweat of your face you will eat bread, till you return to the ground, because from it you were taken; For you are dust, and to dust you shall return.

The promise of hope



First, a promise of hope is given within the pronouncement of consequences...

<u>Genesis 3:15</u>: (NRSV) I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and hers; he will strike your head, and you will strike his heel.

1 Timothy 2:3-4: (KJV) ³For this is good and acceptable in the sight of God our Savior; ⁴Who will have <u>all men to be saved</u>, and to come unto the knowledge of the truth.

There is a theme of universal redemption which we will explain in greater detail. *Everyone has a chance*. Jesus died for everyone who died in Adam.

<u>1 Timothy 2:5-6</u>: (KJV) ⁵For there is one God, and one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus; ⁶Who gave himself a ransom for all, to be testified in due time.



So, what observations have we seen so far?

- God certainly does have a plan.
- Allowing the choice for sin and its consequences is in fact a part of this plan.
- God's plan includes a just payment for the original sin Jesus Christ the righteous.
- Because all are condemned under original sin, all are redeemed by Christ.
- Hope true hope therefore abounds for all of the human race!

Is this fair? What about all of the evil that some perpetrate? What are their consequences?

That is the kind of love this god offers. And that is what bothers me. I'm thrilled that these people survived such a nightmare. But this belief system, which claims to be all about love and peace and humility, has inspired people to think this way about their fellow human beings ... and about themselves.

They got killed and I didn't! That means god loves me! That means I'm important! Even though I'm a detestable sinner, I must still have some worth in the eyes of god, and he just proved it by saving ME while all those OTHERS died!

That is perverse. It's especially perverse coming from a religion that claims to be all about those other things — you know, love and peace and humility. There is no humility there. It is, whether James O'Farrill and Brad Strait and Jennifer Seeger are aware of it or not, an expression of breathtaking arrogance. I would go so far as to call it a kind of narcissism.

- In another part of the theater was another man with the same instinct, John Larimer. He jumped over his seat to cover up his girlfirend, Julia. On Fox News, she told her side of it.
- He just jumped over and held my head tight and put his body in front of mine and in the process got shot.
- These stories are heartbreaking but also inspiring.

<u>2 Peter 3:7-9</u>: (NASB) ⁷But by His word the present heavens and earth are being reserved for fire, kept for the day of judgment and destruction of ungodly men. ⁸But do not let this one fact escape your notice, beloved, that with the Lord one day is like a thousand years, and a thousand years like one day. ⁹The Lord is not slow about His promise, as some count slowness, but is patient toward you, not wishing for any to perish but for all to come to repentance.

The whole idea of explaining the coming to repentance in the context of the Day of Judgment being a thousand years shows that there is work and accountability involved. This is ultimately the best possible news for everyone - for even though all of our actions will meet with accountability, there is still a chance for life.

• I have honestly thought I was going to die. This movie came out and I was super excited to see it... it turned into something horrific. ... There were bodies covered in blood and I've never seen that before... You see it on TV but you don't feel it... Me and everyone else in there are feeling it. The image in our heads is stuck in there. Honestly, I'm never going to forget this night because it was the first time I saw something that was real. Like a real life nightmare.

We are really desensitized to this type of tragedy. There are millions of people who die tragically that we never even notice.

This shows us God's wisdom! ¹⁰For as the rain and the snow come down from heaven, and do not return there until they have watered the earth, making it bring forth and sprout, giving seed to the sower and bread to the eater, This shows us God's justice! ¹¹so shall my word be that goes out from my mouth; it shall not return to me empty, but it shall accomplish that which I purpose, and succeed in the thing for which I sent it. It helps to realize that an airplane spends 90% of its time in error. We need to take a look at that. If you could see that you could get an airplane from New York to London, even while having been in error ninety percent of the time, maybe you could be less critical of yourself... A sailboat cannot get from where it is to where it wants to be by traveling in a straight line. It has to zigzag. So in terms of true course, it's always in error. Zechariah 8:20-23: (KJV) ²⁰Thus saith the LORD of hosts; It shall yet come to pass, that there shall come people, and the inhabitants of many cities: ²¹And the inhabitants of one city shall go to another, saying, Let us go speedily to pray before the LORD, and to seek the LORD of hosts: I will go also. ²²Yea, many people and strong nations shall come to seek the LORD of hosts in Jerusalem, and to pray before the LORD. ²³Thus saith the LORD of hosts; In those days it shall come to pass, that ten men shall take hold out of all languages of the nations, even shall take hold of the skirt of him that is a Jew, saying, We will go with you: for we have heard that God is with you.

All the nations together will join together in praying before the Lord. Notice the Jewish people are an important part in the unfolding of God's plan. Jerusalem is the holy city and God will fight for the Jews.

Revelation 21:3-4: (KJV) ³And I heard a great voice out of heaven saying, Behold, the tabernacle of God is with men, (not just Christians, not just Jews) and he will dwell with them, and they shall be his people, and God himself shall be with them, and be their God. ⁴And God shall wipe away all tears from their eyes; and there shall be no more death, neither sorrow, nor crying, neither shall there be any more pain: for the former things are passed away.

The "former things" have passed away - sin, dying, injustice, evil. This gives us great hope.



Why is there this great hope? Jesus! That's why!!

Romans 5:18-19: (NRSV) ¹⁸Therefore just as one man's trespass led to condemnation for all, so one man's act of righteousness leads to justification and life for all. ¹⁹For just as by the one man's disobedience the many were made sinners, so by the one man's obedience the many will be made righteous.

Who were made sinners? Everyone. Who will be made righteous through Jesus? Everyone. Everyone who was made a sinner under Adam has an opportunity to be made righteous under Jesus. Through the Day of Judgment comes an opportunity to prove yourself as willing to follow the rules of God. There is hope in a world gone mad, where sin, death, sorrow and tragedy are a daily occurrence. The Scriptures tell us this is only temporary and that because Jesus came and died as a ransom for all that everyone will have an opportunity to benefit from that sacrifice.

But of course it was no more than a human century. In 1994, the historian Eric Hobsbawm wrote that 187 million people were "killed or allowed to die by human decision" in what he called the "short century"-a period of about 75 years from 1914 to 1991. The period chosen by Hobsbawm spanned the beginning of World War I to the dissolution of the Soviet Union and the end of the Soviet occupation of its Eastern European "allies." Given that Hobsbawm is a Marxist historian, his choice of the category "by human decision" was particularly significant. However, the sum that he provided was low by just about 44 million people for the full twentieth century, during which approximately 231 million people died in wars and conflict and, in very large numbers, "by human decision."

Realize, that by the "human decision" of just three men - Adolf Hitler, Joseph Stalin and Mao Zedong - there were nearly 60 million people wiped out in the 20^{th} century.



God's promises always come true. The following promise is one of the most pivotal in all of scripture:

Genesis 22:15-18: (ASV) ¹⁵And the angel of Jehovah called unto Abraham a second time out of heaven, ¹⁶and said, By myself have I sworn, saith Jehovah, because thou hast done this thing, and hast not withheld thy son, thine only son, ¹⁷that in blessing I will bless thee, and in multiplying I will multiply thy seed as the stars of the heavens, and as the sand which is upon the seashore. And thy seed shall possess the gate of his enemies. ¹⁸And in thy seed shall all the nations of the earth be blessed. Because thou hast obeyed my voice.

This promise is repeated...

Genesis 26:1-4: (ASV) ¹And there was a famine in the land, besides the first famine that was in the days of Abraham. And Isaac went unto Abimelech king of the Philistines, unto Gerar. ²And Jehovah appeared unto him, and said, Go not down into Egypt. Dwell in the land which I shall tell thee of. ³Sojourn in this land, and I will be with thee, and will bless thee. For unto thee, and unto thy seed, I will give all these lands, and I will establish the oath which I sware unto Abraham thy father. ⁴And I will multiply thy seed as the stars of heaven, and will give unto thy seed all these lands. And in thy seed shall all the nations of the earth be blessed.

And repeated again - get the idea that this is important to the plan??

Genesis 28:11-14: (ASV) ¹¹And (Jacob) lighted upon a certain place, and tarried there all night, because the sun was set. And he took one of the stones of the place, and put it under his head, and lay down in that place to sleep. ¹²And he dreamed. And behold, a ladder set up on the earth, and the top of it reached to heaven. And behold, the angels of God ascending and descending on it. ¹³And, behold, Jehovah stood above it, and said, I am Jehovah, the God of Abraham thy father, and the God of Isaac. The land whereon thou liest, to thee will I give it, and to thy seed. ¹⁴And thy seed shall be as the dust of the earth, and thou shalt spread abroad to the west, and to the east, and to the north, and to the south. And in thee and in thy seed shall all the families of the earth be blessed.

We have NOT YET seen the fulfillment of this promise!

Here are a few more results of God's glorious Kingdom:

From trouble comes prosperity:

Micah 4:1-5: (KJV) ¹But in the last days it shall come to pass, that the mountain of the house of the LORD shall be established in the top of the mountains, and it shall be exalted above the hills; and people shall flow unto it. ²And many nations shall come, and say, Come, and let us go up to the mountain of the LORD, and to the house of the God of Jacob; and he will teach us of his ways, and we will walk in his paths: for the law shall go forth of Zion, and the word of the LORD from Jerusalem. ³And he shall judge among many people, and rebuke strong nations afar off; and they shall beat their swords into plowshares, and their spears into pruninghooks: nation shall not lift up a sword against nation, neither shall they learn war any more. ⁴But they shall sit every man under his vine and under his fig tree; and none shall make them afraid: for the mouth of the LORD of hosts hath spoken it. ⁵For all people will walk everyone in the name of his god, and we will walk in the name of the LORD our God forever and ever.

From trouble comes the unending reign of God:

<u>Daniel 7:13-14</u>: (NRSV) ¹³As I watched in the night visions, I saw one like a human being coming with the clouds of heaven. And he came to the Ancient One and was presented before him. ¹⁴To him was given dominion and glory and kingship, that all peoples, nations, and languages should serve him. His dominion is an everlasting dominion that shall not pass away, and his kingship is one that shall never be destroyed.
