<u>Hebrews 11:1</u>: (Rotherham) But *faith* <**4102**> is, of things hoped for, a confidence, of facts, a conviction, when they are not seen;

Faith: Strong's #4102 persuasion, credence, conviction; reliance

Faith is always from the same Greek word in the entire New Testament.

Credulity: noun

readiness or willingness to believe especially on slight or uncertain evidence (gullibility)

Real, sound and biblical faith is NOT credulity. True, deep and powerful faith must be built and developed as any muscle must be built and developed - in degrees and stages.

June 1998 Program I

"Provoke One Another to Love and Good Works" We began as a one-hour Friday morning program from 9:00-10:00am Eastern on Connecticut radio station, WSUB. We were scared and did a lot of rambling at the very beginning!

Christian Questions, June 12, 1998

(Rick) Good morning, everyone. This is Rick and you are listening to Christian Questions. This is a brand new radio program and I'm here with my buddy Jonathan and my other buddy Shawn who is behind the board and we are here to encourage people to read the Bible. Jonathan, our show is brand new. As a matter of fact I'm scared to death sitting here behind a microphone on the radio.

- (Jonathan) I know what you mean. (Rick laughs)
- (Rick) And I think we ought to start out first of all by thanking people for listening to us and giving a little bit of a background on who we are and what we are about and how we ended up here on the radio.
- (Jonathan) The thing I'm excited about is to hear the lessons that people have learned through the Bible and through their own experiences so we can all share and grow together.



We have to apply faith in our lives:

James 2:14-17: (NASB) ¹⁴What use is it, my brethren, if someone says he has faith but he has no works? Can that faith save him? ¹⁵If a brother or sister is without clothing and in need of daily food, ¹⁶and one of you says to them, Go in peace, be warmed and be filled, and yet you do not give them what is necessary for their body, what use is that? ¹⁷Even so faith, if it has no works, is dead, being by itself.

We had an opportunity to take our faith and put it to work in a way we had never done before. It started with the desire to bring praise, honor and glory to our Heavenly Father. We did not know how or what we wanted to do, but we knew we wanted to do something. Through many experiences, we saw this door open and there we went! We took a step forward without knowing what would be on the other side.

(Christian Questions, March 21, 1999)

- (Rick) I wanted to get your comment on what you said earlier about the year 2000 is a man-made date.
- (Len) Yes, if we look at God's calendar, certainly we use a Julian calendar and that was one that was created by man not God. Your January 1, 2000 is our date; it's not a date God has put there, and it's one that we have created the problem on, so while it certainly is an indication that there are issues surrounding it, this is not a date God put in for us to be fearful of because He is going to bring about some big change. I think it is a sign of times that are going on around us and that's what we should be aware of. It is an indication of how much we are dependent on each other and on the technology we have driven.
- (Len) I think the Scriptures are very clear that what we need to do is continually look to the Lord for our guidance and to have faith in what He has promised to us; that He will take care of us. He will bring us through if we are His children. Those promises make us go beyond fear.
- (Rick) Okay. A Scripture along those lines that we were just talking about during the break, <u>Matthew 6:27-34</u> says, "Which of you by taking thought can add one cubit unto his
 - stature?" I like that because I am short. And I've given it a lot of thought and it never works (Jonathan and Shawn laughing.)
- (Len) It also says add one hair to your head. (Everyone laughing) But you're not bald.
- (Rick) I'm in good shape that way.
- (Shawn) I cover that.
- (Rick) Shawn's got us covered on that or uncovered on that part as the case may be.




From the start, we tried to focus on things that were important and scripturally based, but in a format in which we could have fun as well.



Listeners may not realize just how far Rick lives from the radio station. Sunday mornings mean waking up at 4:40am to leave the house to get to the station in time. (Which is a whole hour later than it used to be in the year 2000!)

Is there a difference between faith and feeling? How do they relate to each other?

Biblical faith has surety and conviction behind it whereas credulity has only a willingness and feeling. The first problem we encounter is many who say that they "believe" in the Bible are merely being credulous.

Feeling deep emotions, if taken and applied first, can and most often lead us to credulity, for emotions seek to be validated simply because they exist.

9/11 took us all by surprise. We changed our broadcast that week to focus on the tragedy and had guest David Stein with us as we spoke from a young peoples' Bible Seminar.

- (1)) CQ Program #172, 9/11 reaction, Why Does God Permit Such Tragedy? Christian Questions, September 16, 2001
 - (Rick) So, that Scripture talks about "a time of trouble such there never was since there was a nation." And Jonathan, we look at September 11, 2001 as a day that will live in the minds of this world for generations. On that day less than one week ago, the world changed, as we were all eyewitnesses to one of the most horrifying terrorist attacks on innocent people in modern history. Thousands upon thousands of human beings had their lives wrenched away as





terrorist acts of a few altered the course of many. In the wake of this horrific discussion, the resounding question that rings in the ears of millions is this: Why? Why does God permit such evil, such destruction and suffering upon the innocent? The answer we are given by the great theological minds of our time is, "We don't know." This morning we would like to challenge that "we don't know" answer and look to see if the Bible does in fact reveal an answer of greater substance. Why does God permit such tragedies? Let's see what the Bible says.

That has been a recurring theme for us - to challenge typical answers by coming back to Scripture.

Our feelings can be crushed during a tragedy - this is where true faith has to have a foundation. True faith cannot be founded on how you think it ought to

be, but on how it is. Faith absolutely can and should lead to feeling and strong emotion that will back it up and keep us reminded of the "why" of our faith. Our faith must have a solid, clear, visionary "why."

We did a program after the Rhode Island Night Club Fire where 100 people died. Some tragedies hit closer to home than others, as Jonathan's friend, Mel, died in that fire.



- CQ Program #243, Rhode Island nightclub tragedy introduction, When Tragedy Strikes Where is God? Christian Questions February 23, 2003
 - (Jonathan) Our question is, "When tragedy strikes where is God?" And our theme text is found in Psalm 30:5. "For His anger is but for a moment, His favor is for a lifetime. Weeping may linger for a night but joy comes with the morning."
 - (Rick) Jonathan, life is full of tragedy and we've seen that this week. Each and everyday thousands of people experience tragic events of all kinds. There are the tragedies of broken homes, drugs, abuse, sickness, sorrow, war, terrorism and some tragedies hit closer to home than others. This past Thursday, the 21st of February, was one such tragedy. Ninety-six people died in a nightclub fire just over there in Rhode Island. One of the casualties was a friend of WSUB and more specifically a friend of ours. Mel worked with your company, Jonathan.
 - (Jonathan) That's right.
 - (Rick) Cleaning the radio station on a weekly basis. So, he was always here and everybody knew him.
 - (Jonathan) That's right.
 - (Rick) Without warning, his life, like the lives of 95 others, were just taken away suddenly and in a very untimely manner. So, the question is why do these things happen? If God loves us, and He does, then why does He allow tragedy?

Can anybody here, know our old friend Mel?

Jonathan: Another memorable program for me was when we looked at the tragedy of the Sandy Hook Elementary School shooting. My son, Paul, is a funeral director and he was here with his boss who discussed the grieving process. Please see our program from December 23, 2012, "What Hope Can There Be in the Face of Such Tragedy?"



David Stein, our CQ friend, periodic co-host and inspiration, called in to talk about the 9/11 program he was a part of. Even in tragedy, there are things our great God has in mind for the blessing of all of mankind in the future.

The Christian Questions Story continues...

There was a Sunday in 2004 when both Jonathan and Vicki, our back up cohost, were out of town. Vicki played an important role in learning how to operate the sound board for the radio program as well as co-hosting and contributing to the weekly content.

Rick needed a co-host and talked his two daughters into joining him. Amy was 16 years old and Emily was 19.

- Christian Questions, January 11, 2004
 - (Rick) Is the idea of being trustworthy, is that something that is commonly spoken about, talked about, taught in your daily school routine?
 - (Emily) No.
 - (Rick) Why?
 - (Emily) Because people just don't value it anymore.
 - (Rick) What happened to being trustworthy? Why don't people value it?
 - (Emily) They just don't think it's that important, society.
 - (Rick) Okay.
 - (Amy) Society nowadays, they are so wrapped up in themselves that you know being trustworthy isn't being self-centered. You have to consider everyone else when you're a trustworthy person. It's someone you can go to who you know will be there for you no matter what. And nowadays it's, well if you know it doesn't benefit me, then I'm really not going to care that much because I'm self-centered like that.
 - (Rick) Oh, okay. Do you ever get that way?
 - (Amy) No. (Amy says sarcastically and everyone laughs.)
 - (Rick) Really? (Everyone laughs again.)

Faith can and needs to be able to stand and endure in the absence of feelings, for true and abiding faith is far deeper and stronger than any feeling we might have.



(1) CQ Program #286, Emily - Wisdom, What Makes a Virtuous Woman? Christian Questions January 11, 2004

- (Rick) Is wisdom an important part of your life?
- (Emily) Well, I think it should be, but I think a lot of it has to do with people having intelligence. People are smart. We aren't trying to say people are stupid because they don't know how to think. It's more like they just don't know how to apply it. Like the definition says, "you can be the smartest person in the world and if you don't know what to do with what you have, you're not going to go anywhere."

In 2005, the WSUB radio station changed to an all-Spanish format, so we were essentially off the air. Their talk radio changed to FM and we moved to WXLM. The listenership exploded on FM radio.

All of our caller input was not agreeable, but it was stimulating!

- (1))CQ Program #398, Don God is cruel in his mystery, Do You Follow Truth or Heresy? Christian Questions, April 30, 2006
 - (Listener "Don") How many hundreds of thousands of young children are dragooned by their parents off to church school every Sunday? Not counting those who have to go to CCD (Catholic catechism/Sunday School) and confirmation class in order to do what? To study a book that you just now described as deliberately being written so as not to be understood?
 - (Rick) Well...
 - (Don) What an exercise in cruelty.
 - (Rick) Well, no, now again, not necessarily. Because what you have is within the Scriptures is a compass, if you will, for moral and ethical living and a way to understand that there is something far greater than we ourselves, and that is the Almighty God. So, even if someone doesn't have a clear grasp, they can get those things out of the Bible. They have done wondrous things with their life and they can live a much higher quality life even if they don't have understanding of all the details.
 - (Don) If the book has been written so as to be not understandable, then it's not worth bothering with.
 - (Rick) Well, and you can see it that way, that's fine.
 - (Don) Darn right I do!
 - (Rick) Okay.

This caller was a sincere, well-educated, thoughtful individual who we were able to meet in person several times. We appreciated his calling in many times.



We have had a regular caller, Julius, who always has something good to contribute from a scriptural perspective. "Gentlemen, I love a Bible study," he regularly says. We also are thankful for Randall, a wonderful listener who regularly contributed for many years.

Since 2010, Jakim has been the owner/founder of Orange Hill Media, a radio production and media consultation company. He first came across Christian Questions in 2009 when searching for Christian talk radio programs online to fit into radio programming in Indiana. He came across ChristianQuestions.com and listened, realizing there was something different about us. The concept was atypical and refreshing. He liked that we looked at different angles when covering a topic and had ideas about how to improve the program structure.



In addition to bringing more modern imaging to the group, he provided much professional criticism on how we could improve. We were humbled someone found our website and saw there was a potential to step up and grow. Per Jakim, moving to podcasting means an unlimited, worldwide audience without the restrictions common to terrestrial (over the air broadcasting) radio stations, like not being able to move broadcast times, ownership changes, etc. CQ already has many online followers and received a tremendous response to the CQ app. We developed a new website in conjunction with the new podcast launch on Monday, July 25, 2016. Followers all over the world can easily listen to a podcast.





(Listeners are free to donate but funds are NEVER solicited.) John 14:12:they will do even greater things than these. The Lord has blessed CQ with a great opportunity through podcasting.

In 2012, the movie "The Avengers" was a big hit. It was suggested CQ do a program on God's Superheroes.

- (1) CQ Program #712 Superman, Are Christians God's Superheroes? Christian Questions, June 3, 2012
 - (Rick) Isn't that the way of a superhero?
 - (Jonathan) It is!
 - (Rick) So, Jonathan who is your favorite superhero? Go ahead.
 - (Jonathan) Alright. It is Superman.
 - (Rick) Alright. Well, here I've got something for you. (Theme music from the original Superman television show) Do you remember this?
 - (Jonathan) Oh, I do!
 - (Rick) This goes back to the 1950's.
 - (Superman show) Faster than a speeding bullet. More powerful than a locomotive. Able to leap tall buildings in a single bound. Look up in the sky! It's a bird! It's a plane! It's Superman! Yes, it's Superman, strange visitor from another planet who came to earth with powers and abilities far beyond those of mortal men. Superman! Who can change the course of mighty rivers? Bend steel in his bare hands and who disguised as Clark Kent...
 - (Rick) And of course we know the rest. That's the original introduction from the original television series, Superman. So, why was Superman your favorite?
 - (Jonathan) Because he was so unique compared to many other superheroes. He could fly.





- (Rick) He could fly.
- (Jonathan) And that was to me the greatest power and ability to zip here and there wherever he wants to.

CQ Program #712 - Mighty Mouse, Are Christians God's Superheroes? Christian Questions, June 3, 2012

- (Rick) Before we get into that, though...
- (Jonathan) Are you going to tell us what your favorite superheroes were? We are dying to hear it.
- (Rick) Yeah, yeah. Well, you know when I was a kid, my favorite hero of all time, bar none, way beyond anything else, was...Fred, play the music.
- (Mighty Mouse theme starts playing) "Here I come to save the day. That means that Mighty Mouse is on the way. Yes sir, when there is a wrong to right."
- (Rick) That's right.
- (Mighty Mouse theme continues) "Mighty Mouse will join the fight. On the sea or on the land he gets the situation well in hand. Whoosh!"
- (Rick) Mighty Mouse.
- (Jonathan) He was fast.
- (Rick) He was the mouse man. I mean the man mouse. I mean. Yeah, I was

small; I'm still small - never quite got to 5'5," but that's another story. I Got to 5'4 and 7/8" and could never just push through the envelope to get to 5'5". But anyway, he was a little guy who packed a punch and I really could identify with that.

• (Jonathan) There you go.

• (Rick) So, it was definitely Mighty Mouse for me. And actually, Fred, turn your mic on for a second. Fred, how tall are you?



(Rick) Ok, now he's about one foot taller than me. Now Fred, when you were a kid, were you bigger than all the other kids or smaller?



- (Rick) And who was your favorite superhero when you were a kid?
- (Fred) Oh, I loved Mighty Mouse.
- (Rick) Ha! See! Why?
- (Fred) Well, I don't know. He was totally fearless.
- (Rick) Yeah. See?
- (Jonathan) There you go.
- (Rick) See, there you go. There you have it.



That is another thing about doing a program like this for so long...people get to understand who you are and where you are coming from, which helps you to be relatable to the average person.



One of Jonathan's personal superheroes is Kathy, who has stepped in over the years to co-host when Jonathan has not been available. (She is also part

of the Rewind team and works on weekly research for the programs.)

Vicki has also heroically stepped in to co-host and screen calls when needed and is another volunteer who works

on weekly research projects.

(Rick) Hi. I'm Rick, co-host of Christian Questions. A unique Bible-based talk show that can be heard live Sunday mornings from 7:00 to 9:00. (Rick bursts out laughing) Don't react! I saw you! I saw you out of the corner of my eye! Aw, man!



Thanks to all of the call screeners throughout the years, including Trish, Matt, Vicki, Faith, Paul and others. Thanks to Fred and Matt behind the sound board. Thanks to Kris, who manages the website and can seemingly answer any question asked.



Another volunteer, John, created the CQ App, which has been very successful in bringing people to the program in a new way.





At least two programs from 2014 were special to us in the story of Christian Questions because they brought clarity to faith in action. The first features Vicki, a long-time friend, sister and often co-host of CQ who was battling cancer at the time.

(Christian Questions, June 29, 2014) Constitution (Christian Questions) Christian Questions, June 29, 2014



- (Rick) Read the Scripture and just explain what jumped out at you this time.
- (Vicki) "My brothers and sisters whenever you face trials of any kind consider it <u>nothing but joy</u> because you know that the testing of your faith produces endurance, and let endurance have its full effect so that you may be mature and complete lacking in nothing."
- (Rick) So, you really emphasized, "...consider it nothing but joy."
- (Vicki) In my head, that Scripture always said, "consider it joy."



- (Rick) Hmm.
- (Vicki) But I missed the "nothing but" part. And that's the hard part.
- (Rick) So, over the last several weeks you've had a lot of opportunity to look at those words and really apply them.
- (Vicki) Correct. And have failed on a time or two. But you know, there are times when my focus is correct and I realize like I was saying to you before I'm not fighting cancer. That is not my battle. I'm fighting my character to be a Christian. I am fighting to be fruitful. God has chosen cancer as the battleground, but that's not my battle. Whether I win or lose at cancer is not my focus.
- (Rick) Alright. Alright. Hold on, because that's one of those things where you say, "What?! What do you mean you're not fighting cancer?"
- (Vicki) That can't be my focus every day, because if that were my focus, my fruit would be probably pride, determination. Those aren't things the Lord is telling me to have. The Lord has this list of love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, gentleness, faithfulness and self-control. Those are what I'm focusing on, I'm praying by the end of this battle I can be a better person and I can be more Christ-like.
- (Rick) So, then what you're saying is the cancer is simply the method through which your Christian development is going to happen.
- (Vicki) Correct.
- (Rick) Alright, and folks understand, we are not talking theoretically here. I'm talking to somebody who has lost all of her hair and and she is sitting across from me without any hair on her head.
- (Jonathan) She has an infection in her lungs.
- (Ricks) And she has an infection in her lungs, and she's saying, "Look, it's not the cancer. That is not what I'm worried about. It's the development of Christian character." Understand the power of stepping out of the circumstance and into the overruling of God.

The second program we want to focus on features Rick's daughter, Amy, who was raped at age 15. After facing this challenge as a family for MANY years, we all agreed to share her story. What was once a tragic story became a story of hope.

Christian Questions, August 31, 2014

- (Rick) What happened to the guy? He was arrested but what happened to him?
- (Amy) He fled the country.
- (Rick) So, he never met justice.
- (Amy) No.
- (Rick) He left. So, to this day, twelve years later, we believe he is out of the country. Most people say when you have a situation like this and you go through a trial, there is closure. Well, you didn't get that closure.
- (Amy) Right.
- (Rick) Well, how did you close it?
- (Amy) Initially, it was devastating. It just was so unfair. It felt like I was robbed. You know, I needed that, I thought I needed that.
- (Rick) Ah...you thought you needed that.



• (Amy) ...and I didn't get it. Eventually, I just forgave myself. That's key and I forgave him in a sense, because this experience doesn't define who I am. This isn't who I am. I don't have to hurt every day because of this. This is just something that happened. It's not me and that's the part of

closure that you need. It's not the justice part, per se. It helps, but you can have the justice without that part and you'll still be lost. The key is to come back home and to be who you are regardless and not let pain define you. It's what you do with that pain, and it's getting through it and getting past it and putting it in that box and closing the door.



That was the hardest program for Rick because it was so personal. We received wonderful feedback from listeners who were helped by this program. Part of our privilege has been to be able to get through core difficulties of life and deal with them in a scriptural, godly perspective. There is always hope!



His understanding is inscrutable. ²⁹He gives strength to the weary, and to him who lacks might He increases power. ³⁰Though youths grow weary and tired, and vigorous young men stumble badly, ³¹Yet those who wait for the LORD will gain new strength; They will mount up with wings like eagles, they will run and not get tired, they will walk and not become weary.

Our thoughts and prayers for you are that you walk and not become weary because you put your strength in God, His Will and His way. Remember, Jesus taught us to pray *Thy kingdom come*, *Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven*.
