SHOW NOTES

1. What do the Scriptures say when it comes to people having different points of view? Does the Bible allow for these differences? How do you feel when you are wrong and how do you typically react? How should you react? (See Colossians 2:16, Romans 14:15)
2. What characteristics does the Bible use to describe the two kinds of people that are “weak in faith” and “otherwise”? Who is doing the judging in these scriptures? Should we be judging another person according to what we think is right? Why? (See Romans 14:1-4)
3. What qualities characterize modern society? How does the Bible say that we should present ourselves to others who are unreasonable? How can we be more like Jesus in this respect? (See 1 Timothy 4:1-2; 1 Peter 2:18-25).
4. Having a pure conscience is one key to figuring out the right and wrong in our lives. Even if we are wrong, can we be acceptable to God? How is this possible? (See Romans 14:5-6)
5. In Romans 14:7-8, what is the clear objective of both groups? What was Paul trying to say here? Does this mean that those in Christianity can do whatever they want? Why? (See Romans 6:1-7)
6. Even if we believe someone else to be wrong, how do the Scriptures say we should treat one another? How should we look at ourselves? (See Matthew 7:1-5, Ephesians 4:14-15, Philippians 4:11-13)
7. What does the Apostle Paul say about judging others who may have a different point of view? From what perspective should we see them? (See Romans 14:9-23)
8. What is the difference between passion and principle? What should we filter our passions through? (See John 15:12-15, Galatians 5:16-17, Romans 14:13-19)
9. What is the difference between caring and coddling? Should we coddle or shelter new believers from the consequences of their actions? Why? (See Galatians 6:1, 1 Corinthians 5:4-5)
10. Even if we are right in a situation, how does God’s Word say that we should react? What advice does the Apostle Paul give for handling this circumstance? How will you handle your actions when you are wrong and what will you do to improve? (See Romans 14:20-23, Ephesians 4:29-32, Philippians 3:3-15)
