1. What are the two institutions God set up for humanity from the beginning? Why did God create Eve? Explain the biblical concept of “helper” as it applies to the relationship between husband and wife. (See Genesis 2:24, 2:18-25, Psalm 33:20)
2. How does God view marriage? How should we regard the covenant of marriage between spouses and before God?
3. What is some practical advice based on Biblical teaching for maintaining a strong marital commitment? (See Ephesians 4:26, Philippians 2:3-5)
4. How did Jesus refocus the Pharisees’ question on divorce? What can happen if a spouse lets his/her mind dwell on excuses and rationalizations for bad behavior? How can we learn the skill of honest communication? (See Matthew 19:3-8, Ephesians 4:25, Luke 8:15)

9. Of what greater biblical concept and purpose is the institution of marriage a model? After commitment, what is one of the most important qualities in a successful marriage? (See Ephesians 3:29-33)
10. What advice does the Bible give on practicing selfless love as it applies to our own marriages? What advice do you have for others in maintaining a strong marriage? What new tools and lessons will you apply in your own relationship? (See Philippians 2:1-4, 2 Peter 1:10)
