1. If we act in accordance with sin, what are the consequences regarding our relationship with God? How did Adam's transgression affect all of humanity who came after him? What was the result of Jesus' act of righteousness? (See Romans 5:18)
2. What are five lessons in Psalms 19:12-13? Why should we follow God's methods and teachings about how we should live? (See Psalms 19:10-11)
3. Explain the two types of sin listed in Psalm 19:12. What are the three doors through which all sin is conceived, developed and expressed? What tools does God give us to help us deal with sin? (See 1 John 2:15-17, Psalms 19:7-9)
4. How does Jesus save us from the death sentence that is passed down from Adam's transgression to all of his offspring? What must we do to remove our sins in God's eyes? (See Romans 5:8-9)
