SHOW NOTES

1. What did God tell Adam would happen if he ate the fruit of the tree in Genesis 2:17? What actually happened to Adam after his death? What is the biblical explanation of a human soul? (See Genesis 2:7,17)
2. What does the Bible teach about the fate of those who remain incorrigible? How do these verses prove that we do *not* have an immortal soul? (See Psalm 37:20, Acts 3:23)
3. How would you respond to the interpretation of Isaiah 66:24-26 that says that people are literally looking at those burning in hell? What is the definition of a corpse in these verses? How does the Bible use the same word in other scriptures? (See Leviticus 26:30, Numbers 14:29)
4. How do we correctly explain the Parable of the Rich Man and Lazarus? Who do the characters represent? How do we know Abraham was not literally in heaven? (See Luke 16:19-24, Ecclesiastes 9:5-10, John 3:13, Hebrews 11:39-40, Matthew 11:11)
5. What are the correct and applicable meanings of the words “tormented” and “flame” in Luke 16:24?
6. How do we know this parable is *not* about Lazarus, Jesus’ friend? What was Jesus telling the Pharisees? (See Luke 16:30-31)
7. What does God say about the practice of human sacrifice (child sacrifice) on the altars of Molech and Baal? What is God’s judgment for anyone who participated in these pagan rituals? (See Leviticus 20:1-7, Jeremiah 19:4-6)
8. What is the correct explanation of the word “hell” in 2 Peter 2:4? How does Ephesians 2:2 help to make our understanding clear?
9. What are the three similar words translated “torment” and how are they used? What is the correct translation of that word in Revelation 20:10-15? What happens to Satan, his angels and any of mankind who continue to follow Satan in the future?
10. In Revelation 14:9-11, what do the beast and his image represent? How do we understand these scriptures? What will mankind need to overcome the sins Satan led them into? How does this tie into a Day of Judgement?
11. What is the scriptural description of God’s punishment for those who knowingly refuse to follow Him after they have been brought to a full knowledge of His plan and character? (See 2 Thessalonians 1:7-9, Romans 8:6)
12. How do the Scriptures describe the life and peace that are the rewards of God for those that come to love Him? Can you envision a world like this? (See Isaiah 11:6-9)
