1. What do the following verses say is necessary to be saved? (See Romans 6:23, 3:23-24, 10:9, 12-13, Mark 1:14-15) How are they similar? How are they different? Why is *context* important?
2. What is the *gift of God*? (See Ephesians 2:8) What is expected of us when we realize we have been given this gift? What does the phrase, *believe in your heart*, mean? (See Romans 10:9) What is the only thing that can *separate us from the love of God*? (See Romans 8:38-39)
3. What has to happen to ALL of Adam's offspring because of sin? What would happen to ALL of Adam's offspring if Christ had not died for us? What will happen to ALL of Adam's offspring since Christ did die for us? (See 1 Corinthians 15:21-22, Romans 5:12-17)
4. What are the two paths in God's plan to salvation? (See Matthew 7:13-14, 1 Corinthians 15:23-24) Who fits in these groups, how do they receive salvation and to whom does it apply?
5. What are the three main points of *salvation by invitation*? Why would God purposefully only call a few? (See John 6:44, 12:36-40, Matthew 11:25-26, 7:13-14)
6. What is the difference in the order of events between a Christian's salvation now and the salvation of humanity in the future? Salvation is meant for whom? (See 1 Timothy 2:1-6, 4:10, Romans 5:15-19)
7. Does the *Day of Salvation* in 2 Corinthians 6:2 apply to the Christian today or to the world in the next phase of salvation? How does the 2 Corinthians 6:2 quote differ from the original prophecy of Isaiah 49:8? How does this change our perception of what it means? (See 2 Peter 3:9, 1 Peter 2:11-12, 2 Corinthians 6:2, Isaiah 49:8)
8. How did Jesus describe the life of a true disciple of Christ? What is the purpose of this special class that he has called out at this time? What is the *ministry of reconciliation*? (See Luke 9:22-23, Romans 12:1-2, 1 Peter 2:9, 2 Corinthians 5:18-19)
9. When *all in their tombs...shall come forth*, those who did not follow Christ in this life shall have a *resurrection of "judgment."* What does this judgment mean? (See John 5:28-29, 2 Peter 2:9)
10. How will the rules for personal accountability change after mankind is resurrected? (See Jeremiah 31:29-30) Consider the vision of Isaiah 11:9 and of Isaiah 35. Think of how the world will have to change to fit this vision. What will salvation bring to the world? How will salvation change your life?
