1. As disciples of Christ:

- a. How are we to communicate with those outside our faith? (Luke 6:27-28)
- b. How are we to communicate with those inside our faith? (Hebrews 10:24-25)
- c. Why is this so difficult? (James 3:8-10)

2. Describe the tools to use when we want to be heard:

- a. List four foundations we should stand upon. What is their source? (James 3:17)
- b. What should our attitude be before we open our mouths to speak? Why the comparison to salt? (Colossians 4:2-6)
- 3. **Poisons in our speech:** Discuss how these are destructive elements in our communications.
 - a. Gossip (Romans 1:28-30)
 - b. Judging (Matthew 7:1-3)
 - c. Negativity (James 3:6)
 - d. Complaining (1 Corinthians 6:1-2)

- e. Excuses (Luke 14:16-18)
- f. Exaggeration (Proverbs 10:18-19)
- g. Dogmatism (Ephesians 4:14-15)

4. **Powerful Speech Pointers:** Discuss these scriptural examples of how to improve our communications.

- a. Speak truth and be restrained. (Ephesians 4:25)
- b. Speak positively and relevantly. (Ephesians 4:29-32)
- c. Speak with spiritually-sound discipline, as Jesus would speak. (Ephesians 4:31-32)
- d. Speak selflessly with the cause of the gospel as motivation. (1 Corinthians 9:18-19)
- e. Speak because we listened and understood those we are addressing. (1 Corinthians 9:20-22) How did the Apostle Paul illustrate this?
- f. Speak with the purpose of reflecting discipleship in Christ. (1 Corinthians 9:23)
- g. Speak personally and positively; recount the listener's character traits, their goodness and what they have meant to you. (Philemon 1:1-7)
- h. Approach those you speak with through the love of Jesus. (Philemon 1:8-9)
- i. Paint the big picture with complete honesty. (Philemon 1:10-13)
- j. Lay out a pathway of reasoning formulated with lofty spiritual principles. This reminds the listener of the godly integrity behind the recommendation. (Philemon 1:14-17, James 1:12)
- k. Be authentic in your suggestions. Be willing to do what you ask of others. (Philemon 1:18-21)
- 1. Love those to whom we speak in outward and tangible ways. (Philemon 1:22-23)

5. "*Mirror*" *Questions*: Why am I talking? What is my bottom-line motivation? Am I trying to get back at somebody? Am I trying to weasel my way in to make a point? Am I trying to win adulation from others? OR, am I speaking with the cause of the gospel as the principle that motivates me?
