1. Why is it important for Christians to study ancient Israel's Tabernacle? How does the Apostle Paul's insights into the symbolism God put into the Tabernacle, affect our lives?
2. What are the three important principles taught through the Tabernacle and its rituals? Expand on these. Why are they important?
3. What are the three offerings considered in this podcast? Describe them in detail.
 - a. Leviticus 1:9, 16:11
 - b. Leviticus 1:2-3, 9
 - c. Leviticus 3:1
4. What was the sequence of these three offerings? Why was this significant? Which part of the story did each tell? Connect each offering with one of the principles.
5. Walk through the Tabernacle and describe the spaces, rooms and furniture. Sketch it if you like.
6. **Sin offering:** (Leviticus 4:9, 16:6, 14-15, 30-31, Hebrews 9:11-12, 13:11-13, 1 Corinthians 10:13, 15:21-22)
 - a. On what day were the sin offering sacrifices made? What is it called today?
 - b. What was their purpose? Which animals were used? What was the symbolism of each?
 - c. What was the major difference between the sacrifice of the bull each year and Jesus' sacrifice?
 - d. What are the two parts to the atonement work? How does the Lord's goat sacrifice fit into this work? What do faithful Christians have to offer that is of great value in this redemptive work?
7. **Burnt offering:** (Leviticus 1:3, Ephesians 5:1-2, Psalms 40:8-10)
 - a. How do burnt and peace offerings appear to God?
 - b. How can you give God a metaphorical burnt offering?
 - c. Contrast 1 Corinthians 15:21-22 with Psalms 40:8-10. How do both describe Jesus' sacrifice?
8. **Peace offering:** (Exodus 29:38,39, Leviticus 7:11-16)
 - a. What does the peace offering represent?
 - b. What is symbolized by the ram of consecration's blood being put on the right ear, thumb and toe?
9. Fit the history of your walk with Christ into the three principles: Do you recognize that Jesus gave his life for you and all of mankind? How do you feel about that? How has this understanding transformed your life?
