SHOW NOTES

1. What does Galatians 5:13-17 teach us about the battle we wage between our personal desires and Christian liberty? How does Paul's warning shape our understanding of freedom in Christ?
2. How does Paul's counsel in 1 Corinthians 8:7-12 guide us in using liberty responsibly? What does it reveal about the relational impact of our choices? (also 1 Peter 4:1,3)
3. How can you make sure your words don't just reflect "my truth," but "THE truth"?
4. Are you careful to speak with humility, clarity and scriptural backing? How can you better align your speech with integrity and humility? (John 8:31-21, 36, 2 Peter 2:18-19)
5. When we abide in the "law of liberty," why is it necessary to be "effectual doers"? (James 1:25)
6. What is the connection between laying ALL before God (fully surrendering our anxieties in prayer to Him), and experiencing His peace? How is this peace connected to liberty in Christ? How do we claim this peace? (Philippians 4:4-7, Hebrews 4:15-16, Psalm 19:12)
7. How do you fully surrender your past and present struggles to God in prayer? What might be holding you back from His full peace and joy that is offered through your liberty in Christ?
8. How does Romans 8:18,20-22 describe the future hope of creation being set free from the sin and degradation they are experiencing now? What role do believers play in modeling this liberty amid present suffering?
9. Are there areas in your life where you are tempted to use liberty as an excuse for self-centered choices rather than Christ-centered service? How can you realign your liberties to be focused on what God expects of you?
